INFORMATION FOR VISITORS – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

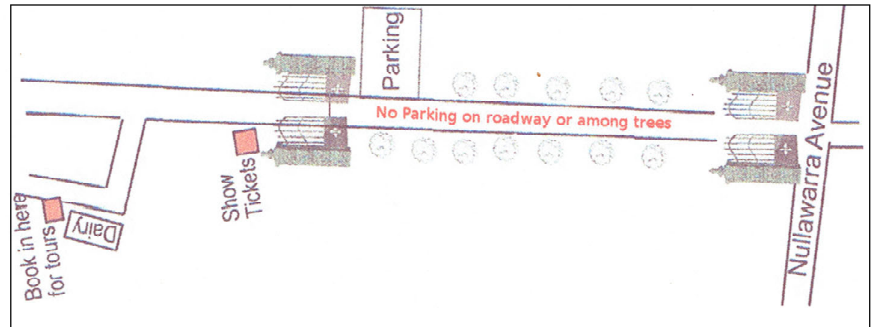
We are privileged to be allowed to conduct these Open Days and we want to know that we will be welcomed back another time. This information is to protect our continued use of the site and for you to have an enjoyable day.

The inner gates will be open from 10:00 am until approximately one hour after the last tour. Admission is by pre-booked ticket only. The only time restriction for you is the guided tour of the grounds. For the rest of the time you are free to visit the Squash Court and the Stables Complex or just wander around the grounds. You can go anywhere except close to the mansion.

BOOKINGS ARE ESSENTIAL

ENTRY & PARKING: Entry is through the gates in Nullawarra Avenue (opposite The Drive), Concord West. Details of where you can park will be shown on your ticket. Please park responsibly to allow maximum use of the area. Cars will not be permitted to enter the grounds.

After parking proceed to the inner gates to present your ticket for entry.



GROUNDS TOURS: These tours start from the Dairy/Devonshire Tea area and take approximately one hour. We suggest that you wear comfortable shoes as there is a lot of walking involved. The first tour is at 10:30 am and they continue every 30 minutes.

Please report to the Booking In Table 15 minutes before the start of your tour to meet your guide.

If you are late for your designated time we may not be able to fit you in to another tour immediately.

MANSION: As the building is now in full-time use as a health facility we are no longer able to access the interior. You are requested to respect the privacy of the residents by staying about 10 metres away from the exterior.

PHOTOGRAPHIC DISPLAY: There will be displays of photographs and other memorabilia pertaining to the Walkers and Yaralla in the Stables complex and the Squash Court. Your guide will take you into these buildings but you are also free to visit them before or after your tour.

CAMERAS are permitted.

PUBLICATIONS: Two books by Patricia Skehan, *The Walker of Yaralla* (\$25.00) and *Where the Blue Wattle Grows* (\$15.00) as well as other publications will be available in the Stable complex. These are also always available at our museum at 1 Bent Street, Concord.

CATERING: Devonshire Teas can be purchased in the dairy building during the day and you can purchase a barbecue lunch and cold drinks from our BBQ Trailer opposite the Dairy building.

RUBBISH: Please dispose of all rubbish thoughtfully. Help us to keep the grounds neat so that we may get permission for further Open Days.

TOILET FACILITIES: There are very limited toilet facilities. There is one at the rear of the mansion and another at the rear of the dairy building.
